**When:** June 17th, 10:30am

There's more to this 'beach' than meets the eye! Learn more about the interconnected story of geography, biology and human history and join us for a casual hike to explore nature in your backyard!

**Degree of Difficulty:** Medium- High (We plan to hike up the trail traversing the bluff face from the lower sandpit area.)

Where: Park your vehicle at Albin Road (on the Reserve side); meet at the Well site.

\*\*\*Please note Poison Ivy is prevalent throughout the site, and there is long grass so long sleeves, long pants and closed toe shoes or boots are highly recommended. Consider water bottles, bug spray, hats or other protective gear.
