FLOATING CONTAINERS: As we advised in recent newsletters, Talpines made a delegation to Tay council to pass a by-law to prevent floating containers (we call

them junk) from our waterways. The coalition involved in this has made great progress, and numerous municipalities have passed bylaws forbidding them. There is a new opportunity to voice your opposition:

Very easy to stop:

Sample comment (feel free to modify for your use!):

Public input request: 'float home' shipping containers

No matter what you call shipping-container 'cottages'--'Float home', 'Vessel', 'Dangerous maritime junk'--they are **unregulated** and **unsafe**.

They are ugly lumps of junk with **no motor**, full of **toxic chemicals**, easily **sunk by storms**.

In open water, such as the Great Lakes and bays, they pose **serious threats** to waterfront integrity, watercraft safety, and water quality.

The only place 'float homes' belong is in a **marina** where they can be serviced, regulated, and removed if unsafe.
